We are working on gathering suggestions from session members in developing our church "Mission Statement." Our mission statement is an embodiment of who we are as a congregation, what we stand for and how we support the teachings of Jesus Christ. After that, we need to complete a "Mission Information Form."

There is a lag time involved with each step, and, of course, the Presbytery has to be consulted along the way. We are blessed by having **Kirk Allen** help guide us through this process and act as our liaison to the Presbytery hierarchy.

So just know we are making progress, but it takes time, and we will update the congregation on a monthly basis. In the meantime, numerous church members from various committees, including Session and Worship, are working diligently to keep services active.

RUMMAGE SALE A SUCCESS!











