

It will be great to see everyone at the same time. We would love to have the pews packed this Sunday.



### MUSIC NOTES

Wow, the summer has flown by! I want to thank all those fine musicians who provided special music these past three months. Now our wonderful choir has had a recuperative rest and is hopefully "raring" to get started again on Rally Day. I am especially excited to be able to introduce on September 22 an anthem arrangement of a hymn from our Presbyterian Hymnal entitled *Many and Great, O God, Are Thy Things*. It is based on a Dakota Native American hymn dating from 1842. I have timed the date of the choir's performance to coincide with Native American Day which is celebrated each year in the Presbyterian Church, USA on the Fall Equinox. Since 1994, Native American Day appears on the Presbyterian Calendar as the day to recognize and celebrate the contributions of Native American Indians to the life of the church and community. It has a pleasing, haunting melody and the words reflect the Native Americans' spirituality and belief in God the Creator. Hopefully, you will like it and will want to sing it as a congregational hymn (# 271) at some point in the future! – Jean Tedrick, Director of Music
